1. **Date:** Monday July 3rd – Friday, July 14th, 2017
2. **Location:** **CENTRAL KINGS RURAL HIGH SCHOOL, CAMBRIDGE**
3. **Time:** 9:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.
4. **Subjects:** English (Academic & Communications)
Mathematics (Academic, Math At Work and Essentials)
Grades 9-12
5. **Cost:**
 - \$300.00 per student
 - **This amount is to be paid on the first morning of Summer School by cash or money order**
 - **Money Orders should be made payable to Valley Institute of Education**
 - A registration form (located in the Guidance Dept of your school) should accompany your fee on the morning of Monday July 3rd. Receipts will be issued at that time
 - **PERSONAL CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**
6. **Assessments:** **Each teacher works diligently to cover the outcomes set forth in the curriculum guide to help prepare the student for his or her next level of education. In all courses, assessments are both formative and summative in nature and occur on a daily basis. Each student will earn a mark based on his or her ability to achieve the outcomes assessed. Please see the document regarding recent changes to entrance requirements and final marks**
7. **Registration:** Please inform potential Summer School students that they can register in one of the following ways:
 - Through their own school before noon on Friday June 30th
 - Contacting the Summer School coordinator, Stan MacVicar at stan.macvicar@avrsb.ca
 - On site at the **CENTRAL KINGS CAFETERIA** between 8:20-9:00 on Monday July 3rd
8. **Attendance:** Attendance at Summer School is **compulsory**
9. **Transportation:** **Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from Summer School at Central Kings High School**
10. **Other:**
 - a) A student may register for only one course at Summer School per year
 - b) Students can earn summer school credits for the same subject in different years of study. Ex.: Math 9 in 2010, Math 11 in 2012
 - c) A student **cannot** take a course in Summer School in which he or she has not been enrolled
 - d) A student must have a mark of **35%** in the subject in which they are registering to attend Summer School. The **EXCEPTION IS MATH 10, which you need a 40% or higher as it is a yearlong course of study**
 - e) It is possible for a student to attend Summer School to improve a mark which is over 50%.

IMPORTANT: **When registering for a course please be specific.**
Ex.: Math 10 Academic OR Math 10 Essentials
